 - Bihar
 - Jharkhand
 - Odisha




Objectives of the Study

- To understand and compare the occupational patterns and employment situation among rural households in Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha
- To analyse income and income inequality situation in eastern India
- To quantify contribution of different farm and nonfarm sources to the total income of the households
- To assess the poverty situation among sample households






Distribution of employed population (primary occupation) in Eastern India: 2010-2012

Education and Occupational Pattern in Eastern India: 2010-2012

| Education level | Occupational Pattern |

| No Formal Schooling | Farming (44%), Nonfarm labor (27%), Farm Labor (17%) |
| Primary attended | Farming (50%), Nonfarm labor (25%), Farm labor (10%) |
| Secondary Attended | Farming (48%), Nonfarm labor (26%), Service (8%) |
| SSC or Intermediate Passed | Farming (39%), Service (23%), Nonfarm labor (17%) |
| Graduate and Above | Service (52%), Farming (29%), Business(8%) |






Duration of employment (days/year) in East India villages: 2010 to 2012





Labor productivity(USD/day) in East India villages: 2010 to 2012






Trends in per capita household income (USD) in East India villages: 2010 to 2012






Trends in per capita household income (USD) in East India villages, by income sources: 2010 to 2012






Trends in per capita household income (USD) in East India villages, by income sources: 2010 to 2012






Income inequality (Gini ratio) in East India: 2010 to 2012





Income inequality (Gini ratio) in East India: 2010 to 2012






Extent of Poverty (Head Count %) among sample households in Eastern India, 2010-2012






Extent of Poverty (Head Count %) among different occupational categories of sample households in Eastern India, 2010-2012






Intensity of Poverty (Poverty Gap) among sample households in Eastern India, 2010-2012






Intensity of Poverty (Poverty Gap) among different occupational categories of sample households in Eastern India, 2010-2012






Severity of Poverty (Squared Poverty Gap) among sample households in Eastern India, 2010-2012

Conclusion

- Role of non-farm sector has increased as occupation and employment among rural households in Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha
- Employment days and wage rate for agricultural labors are lower than other occupations
- Occupational mobility is higher among labors
- Part-time farming has increased among rural households in eastern India
- Per capita real income of the households have increased over the last three years
- Income from both farm and non-farm sources increased



Conclusion

- Income inequality has also increased among all households but varied across states
- Using lower poverty line, extent of poverty has reduced in all the states
- Using upper poverty line, extent of poverty has reduced in Bihar and Jharkhand but increased in Odisha in 2012
- Extent of poverty among labor and small households are still high
- Intensity of poverty reduced for all but remained almost same level for farm households
- Severity of poverty has increased for farm households but decreased for all others
